Port Huron and its surroundings are within a bioregion defined by Lake Huron, St. Clair River and Black River watersheds.

Lake Huron has the largest surface area and the longest shoreline of all the Great Lakes, and is dotted with many islands. The five lakes, Superior, Huron, Michigan, Ontario, and Erie make up the largest body of fresh water on Earth accounting for one-fifth of the freshwater surface on the planet.

Living here brings with it a responsibility to safeguard its integrity.

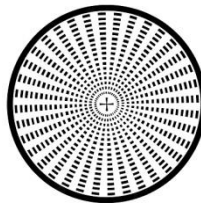
